Cochrane Collaboration international organisation that aims to help people make well-informed decisions about healthcare by preparing, maintaining and promoting the accessibility of systematic reviews of the effects of healthcare interventions.

The Cochrane Oral Health Group (OHG)

aims to produce systematic reviews which primarily include all randomised controlled trials (RCTs) in oral health. Oral health is broadly conceived to include the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of oral, dental and craniofacial diseases and disorders.

The OHG is composed of persons from around the world who share an interest in developing and maintaining systematic reviews relevant to the field of oral health. Reviewers are encouraged to collaborate on reviews and the OHG is able to facilitate contacts with colleagues around the world. The group is co-ordinated by an Editorial Team who edit and assemble completed reviews into modules for inclusion in The Cochrane Library (an electronic database updated quarterly).

Coming soon: RevMan 5!!!

The OHG has signed up to beta testing of RevMan 5.

It is anticipated that this new and improved version will be available mid to late 2007. It will affect all reviewers and, eventually, everyone must use it. As well as supporting the preparation of four types of reviews (Intervention, Diagnostic, Methodology and Umbrella reviews), the software also includes a lot of new functionality that should make it easier to prepare high-quality reviews. A phasing-in period running over three module submissions has been agreed. After RevMan 5 is released:

- For the first issue of The Cochrane Library, authors and CRGs can submit reviews in RevMan 5 format
- For the second issue, authors and CRGs are encouraged to submit their reviews in RevMan 5 format
- For the third issue, authors and CRGs must submit their reviews in RevMan 5 format.

In considering the implications for supporting two versions of RevMan, it is worth noting that reviews in RevMan 5 format are not backwards-compatible with reviews in RevMan 4 format. However, the existing RevMan 4 reviews fit into the new RevMan 5 format without the need for any manual conversion.

All authors on a review team will need to change to RevMan 5 at the same time. New review teams should ideally start using RevMan 5 as soon as it is available, and all authors would obviously need to move to RevMan 5 before RevMan 4 ceased to be supported by The Cochrane Collaboration and Wiley. **We'll keep you posted!** http://www.cc-ims.net/RevMan5/RevMan5/RevMan5
