Cochrane Collaboration The is an international organisation that aims to help people make well-informed decisions about healthcare by preparing, maintaining and promoting the accessibility of systematic reviews of the effects of healthcare interventions.

The Cochrane Oral Health Group (OHG) aims to produce systematic reviews which primarily include all randomised controlled trials (RCTs) in oral health. Oral health is broadly conceived to include the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of oral, dental and craniofacial diseases and disorders.

The OHG is composed of persons from around the world who share an interest in developing and maintaining systematic reviews relevant to the field of oral health. Reviewers are encouraged to collaborate on reviews and the OHG is able to facilitate contacts with colleagues around the world. The group is co-ordinated by an Editorial Team who edit and assemble completed reviews into modules for inclusion in The Cochrane Library (an electronic database updated quarterly).

He was awarded an OBE for services to medicine. Professor Jonathan Shepherd, a member and a referee for oral surgery reviews has been awarded a prestigious international prize, the 2008 Stockholm Prize in Criminology, for his research on late-night city centre violence. - OHG workshop at the UK and Ireland meeting! OHG editor, Dr Valeria Marinho will be facilitating a workshop at 2.15pm on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> March at the 13th Annual Meeting of UK and Ireland Contributors to The Cochrane Collaboration, Park Inn Hotel, York. • RevMan 5 on course for March 2008 release! The major new update of the Collaboration's review writing software is currently being piloted by five Review Groups and their authors. You can now download RevMan 5 Release Candidate at <a href="http://www.cc-ims.net/RevMan/RevMan5">http://www.cc-ims.net/RevMan5</a> in order to read the User Guide and carry out the tutorial. Please note it is strictly for testing and is not the final product. It should not be used to produce or submit review versions.

The Cochrane Collaboration Steering Group will notify all authors of the date by which editorial offices will begin using RevMan 5 to process reviews, and the implications this will have for them and their review teams. Cochrane Centres will provide training.

- Major update of Cochrane Handbook for Systematic Reviews of Interventions! Version 5 of the Handbook is in development and will accompany RevMan 5 on its release. It is the official document that describes in detail the process of preparing and maintaining Cochrane systematic reviews on the effects of healthcare interventions.
