Cochrane Collaboration international organisation that aims to help people make well-informed decisions about healthcare by preparing, maintaining and promoting the accessibility of systematic reviews of the effects of healthcare interventions.

The Cochrane Oral Health Group (OHG) aims to produce systematic reviews which

primarily include all randomised controlled trials (RCTs) in oral health. Oral health is broadly conceived to include the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of oral, dental and craniofacial diseases and disorders.

The OHG is composed of persons from around the world who share an interest in developing and maintaining systematic reviews relevant to the field of oral health. Reviewers are encouraged to collaborate on reviews and the OHG is able to facilitate contacts with colleagues around the world. The group is co-ordinated by an Editorial Team who edit and assemble completed reviews into modules for inclusion in The Cochrane Library (an electronic database updated quarterly).

Change of Co-ordinating Editor

As from the beginning of 2009 our joint Co-ordinating Editor, Bill Shaw (pictured receiving his CBE last year), has stepped down from his role alongside Helen Worthington. Jan Clarkson (also pictured) has now taken over the reigns. Bill, along with Helen Worthington, set up the Manchester editorial base in 1997 and has been instrumental in leading the OHG to its current position as the third most productive Cochrane Review Group of the 24 Department of Health funded UK based Groups. Bill will now lead a 10-year multicentre randomised control trial of the timing of surgery for infants with cleft palate, the findings of which will have relevance for cleft care throughout the world. Jan Clarkson has been an OHG Editor since 1998 and is the Director of the Effective Dental Practice Programme and an Honorary Consultant in Paediatric Dentistry based at the Dental Health Services Research Unit, at the University of Dundee. The staff at the Editorial Base look forward to working closely with Jan and we are confident that she and Helen will ensure that the OHG continues to emulate and build upon our recent success in the coming years. We would like to thank Bill for all his support over the years and it has been a pleasure to work with him!

Other OHG news

- Abstracts of OHG reviews now in French. We are delighted to announce that Jean-Noel Vergnes and Paul Monsarrat of the Department of Dental Epidemiology at the Toulouse Dental School in France have now completed the translation of all OHG review abstracts into French. The translations will be maintained on the Centre Français d'Evidence-Based Dentistry website (http://cfebd.ups-tlse.fr/) under the heading 'Cochrane' from around the 1st of February 2009. Alternatively you can find a link to the translations through the OHG website (www.ohg.cochrane.org). We now have translations in French, German, Japanese and Spanish.
- Cochrane Incentive Scheme. In recent years, the Department of Health in England has funded an annual scheme whereby small incentive payments were offered to Cochrane Review Groups for preparing key new or updated Cochrane reviews by agreed dates. For the third year in a row the OHG has been successful with two reviews put forward. The successful reviews were:

- Tips for authors
 - The person who checks a review draft out of Archie must be the same person who checks it back into Archie.
 - Click save when a draft is checked out to RevMan 5 so that the most recent file can be recovered from RevMan 5 using the 'File > Recent Files' route if necessary.
 - Create an additional table from a table in MS Word by using an appendix as a temporary clipboard. Add new appendix > paste Word table into appendix > right click on table in appendix and choose 'Move to Additional Table' > delete appendix again.
