The Cochrane Collaboration is an international organisation that aims to help people make well-informed decisions about healthcare by preparing, maintaining and promoting the accessibility of systematic reviews of the effects of healthcare

The Cochrane Oral Health Group (OHG)

aims to produce systematic reviews which primarily include all randomised controlled trials (RCTs) in oral health. Oral health is broadly conceived to include the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of oral, dental and craniofacial diseases and disorders.

The OHG is composed of persons from around the world who share an interest in developing and maintaining systematic reviews relevant to the field of oral health. Reviewers are encouraged to collaborate on reviews and the OHG is able to facilitate contacts with colleagues around the world. The group is co-ordinated by an Editorial Team who edit and assemble completed reviews into modules for inclusion in *The Cochrane Library* (an electronic database updated quarterly).

Out of date reviews

Please note the OHG reserves the right to reassign any title, protocol or review to a new review team should the next stage not be delivered in a timely fashion. Our recommended timescales are as follows: title to protocol = 6-9 months; protocol to review = 18 months from publication date of protocol; reviews should be updated every 2 years.

Review teams should contact the editorial base to negotiate/re-arrange submission dates if they foresee that they will not be able to deliver on time.

OHG News

- RAE results & OHG. The Editorial Base of the OHG is accommodated by the School of Dentistry at the University of Manchester. The Research Assessment Exercise (RAE) 2008 results placed the School 1st in the UK in terms of the quality of its academic research – an achievement we are proud to have been part of.
- OHG review amongst Cochrane's finest. The OHG review 'Interventions for
 preventing oral mucositis for patients with cancer receiving treatment' was
 ranked 41st out of around 3500 completed reviews in 2008. Ranking was by the
 number of 2008 full text downloads (i.e. views of the full Cochrane review), on
 the Wiley InterScience platform.
- Congratulations! OHG joint Co-ordinating Editor, Jan Clarkson, who is based at the Dental Health Services Research Unit in Dundee, has been awarded a promotion to a personal chair at Dundee from 4 July. This is fantastic news for Jan and we are delighted for her and thank her for all her support and hard work.

RevMan 5 & Archie tips for authors

- If your computer (or RevMan) crashes while you are working on a review, you will be given the option to open the latest backup of the review the next time you open RevMan.
- We recommend that you check reviews back in to Archie at the end of every editing session, but there may be situations where this is impossible or unnecessary; for example, you may be unable to access the Internet while you are working on a review, or you may be certain that no one else will need to access the review for some time. In such cases, saving your RevMan files to your computer is an option.
- We recommend that all authors complete the RM5 tutorial (the option is given on opening RM5).

Cochrane News

- New online learning resources! We are pleased to announce that the new interactive Online Learning Resources for Undertaking a Systematic Review that have been developed by the UK Cochrane Centre and the University of Portsmouth are now available for authors who have a registered title for a Cochrane review, an active record in Archie and are based in the UK and Ireland. Following this initial roll out of the new resource, we hope to make it available to non-UK based. The reasons for this staggered procedure relate to licensing of the underlying software and the provision of support to users outside the UK. If any UK-based authors wish to take advantage of these resources, please go to www.cochrane.ac.uk and click on 'Online Learning Resources' in the middle of the page. The following modules are now available: 1) Systematic reviews introduction; 2) Meta-analysis introduction; 3) Heterogeneity introduction; 4) Searching for studies; 5) Collecting data. The module 'Writing a protocol' is coming soon. Enjoy!
- Impact factor rises! The 2008 impact factors have now been published by Thomson ISI. The *Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews* has an IMPACT FACTOR OF 5.182 and is ranked 12th out of 107 in the ISI category Medicine, General & Internal. The 2007 IF was 4.654 and the ranking was 14th out of 100.
- Cochrane Library usage. This year, the usage report includes usage on Cochrane.org, OVID, EBSCO, La Bibliotheca Cochrane and BIREME VHL. The findings show that in 2008 there was: A SEARCH of The Cochrane Library every 2 seconds; An ABSTRACT View every 3 seconds; A FULL TEXT Download every 4 seconds.
- Cochrane Opportunities Fund. The winners of this annual competition for funding are: 1) A Course for Cochrane Statisticians: Addressing Advances in Meta Analytical Techniques; 2) Cochrane Training: Developing a Core Collection of Approved Training and Support Materials; 3) Evaluation of The Cochrane Collaboration's Risk of Bias Tool. We look forward to the results of these projects with interest.
