The Cochrane Collaboration is an international organisation that aims to help people make well-informed decisions about healthcare by preparing, maintaining and promoting the accessibility of systematic reviews of the effects of healthcare interventions.

The Cochrane Oral Health Group (OHG)

aims to produce systematic reviews which primarily include all randomised controlled trials (RCTs) in oral health. Oral health is broadly conceived to include the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of oral, dental and craniofacial diseases and disorders.

The OHG is composed of persons from around the world who share an interest in developing and maintaining systematic reviews relevant to the field of oral health. Reviewers are encouraged to collaborate on reviews and the OHG is able to facilitate contacts with colleagues around the world. The group is co-ordinated by an Editorial Team who edit and assemble completed reviews into modules for inclusion in *The Cochrane Library* (an electronic database updated quarterly).

The Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews (CDSR) moves to monthly publication with immediate effect. This represents an important development for the CDSR and The Cochrane Library. We will be able to publish new evidence more rapidly, which we hope will be attractive to review authors, and the changes should also lead to more manageable publication deadlines and opportunities to spread the workload. The way in which reviews are submitted will remain the same and the appearance of the reviews will be unchanged. The OHG Newsletter will remain quarterly, released in January, April, July and October.

OHG News

- OHG publishes 100th review! With the publication of Issue 1, 2010 of *The Cochrane Library* the OHG has reached the significant milestone of 100 published systematic reviews. We also have 74 published protocols and another 42 registered titles. This represents a fantastic achievement for all contributors to The Group and we would like to thank you all and congratulate you. Most importantly it represents a tremendous asset and body of evidence for all end users of this valuable work. This is all at the same time as The Cochrane Collaboration surpasses 4000 published reviews!
- Media interest in OHG reviews! The reviews 'Fluoride toothpastes of different
 concentrations for preventing dental caries in children and adolescents' and
 'Topical fluoride as a cause of dental fluorosis in children' published in the current
 issue (Issue 1, 2010) of *The Cochrane Library* have already been attracting media
 attention. The University of Manchester (UK) and The Health Behavior News
 Service (USA) have both issued press releases.

Author tip of the day

If you just want to read your review or print a copy (without editing), you do not need to check it out to RevMan 5. you can read it directly in Archie by logging into Archie, right-clicking the title in the Resources folder view, and selecting View to read the latest or published version. To obtain a PDF version of the review right-click the title in the Resources folder view and select Download PDF. Otherwise, you can download a (read-only) copy of your review from within RevMan. To do this, go to File > Check Out or click the Check Out button on the main toolbar. In the Check Out window, click the review you want to download and tick the box marked 'Download a copy of the review without locking it for others (not for editing)' (bottom lefthand corner of the Check Out window).
