



Cochrane Collaboration The is an international organisation that aims to help people make well-informed decisions about healthcare by preparing, maintaining and promoting the accessibility of systematic reviews of the effects of healthcare interventions.

The Cochrane Oral Health Group (OHG)

aims to produce systematic reviews which primarily include all randomised controlled trials (RCTs) in oral health. Oral health is broadly conceived to include the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of oral, dental and craniofacial diseases and disorders.

The OHG is composed of persons from around the world who share an interest in developing and maintaining systematic reviews relevant to the field of oral health. Reviewers are encouraged to collaborate on reviews and the OHG is able to facilitate contacts with colleagues around the world. The group is co-ordinated by an Editorial Team who edit and assemble completed reviews into modules for inclusion in The Cochrane Library (an electronic database updated quarterly).

# **Cochrane News**

• Cochrane & Cochrane Library websites. The main Cochrane website and *The Cochrane Library* websites have been redesigned to make them better structured and more user friendly. The Cochrane website (www.cochrane.org) has many new features including:

i) Prominent, easy-to-find link to our product, *The Cochrane Library*, in the header on the right of every page of the site; ii) RSS feeds for various content streams (news, events, jobs and more); iii) Homepage feature Cochrane in the News that highlights recent coverage of Cochrane in the press (also available as an RSS feed); iv) Portals for various user groups from the homepage and as a panel on internal pages; v) Federated search across all content collections including reviews, methodology and colloquia abstracts; vi) Web 2.0 features including social bookmarking tools and links to Cochrane networks; vii) Improved contact pages system; viii) Improved navigation aids including a Site map, Site index, and broken-out menu at the bottom of every page.

# Author tips

You can download a copy of your review in RevMan without locking it for others but this should never be checked back in to Archie. To do this click 'Check Out' then select your review and check the box 'Download a copy of the review without locking it for others (not for editing)' then click 'OK'.

The best way to avoid mix ups within your review team as to which is the very latest version of the review is to check the review back into Archie at the end of every editing session.

If you have any problems checking your review back in, quite often the problem may due to an error. Click 'File' > 'Reports' > 'Validation Report' which will notify you of any problems. Any warnings will not stop you from checking the review in but errors will.

The Cochrane Library website (www.thecochranelibrary.com) is also now much easier to navigate with quick links from the homepage to each major topic area which is in turn broken down into subtopics using a tree view style.

- Cochrane access in Germany. *The Cochrane Library* is now available to more than 650,000 students and faculty at 47 universities in Germany. This German National Academic Opt-In Consortium is open to all academic institutions and university clinics in Germany and allows access to The Cochrane Library for the period from 2010 to 2019.
- New updated CONSORT Statement. The CONSORT (Consolidated Standards of Reporting Trials) Statement is an evidence-based, minimum set of recommendations for reporting randomised controlled trials (RCTs). It facilitates complete and transparent reporting thus aiding their critical appraisal and interpretation. The Cochrane Collaboration believes that all reports of RCTs should follow CONSORT.
