The Cochrane Collaboration is an international organisation that aims to help people make well-informed decisions about healthcare by preparing, maintaining and promoting the accessibility of systematic reviews of the effects of healthcare interventions.

The Cochrane Oral Health Group (OHG) aims to produce systematic reviews which primarily include all randomised controlled trials (RCTs) in oral health. Oral health is broadly conceived to include the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of oral, dental

and craniofacial diseases and disorders.

The OHG is composed of persons from around the world who share an interest in developing and maintaining systematic reviews relevant to the field of oral health. Reviewers are encouraged to collaborate on reviews and the OHG is able to facilitate contacts with colleagues around the world. The group is co-ordinated by an Editorial Team who edit and assemble completed reviews into modules for inclusion in *The Cochrane Library* (an electronic database

- UK & Ireland Annual meeting 2011. The 16th Annual Meeting of UK and Ireland-based contributors to The Cochrane Collaboration will take place in Belfast, Northern Ireland on the 15th and 16th of March 2011. Registration opens soon.
- 2009/10 Annual Report of The Cochrane Collaboration. The Annual Report features updates from the Collaboration's core teams and entity executives, summaries of Cochrane projects, examples of how Cochrane Reviews have changed health care policy, and much more! - Online learning materials. The first phase of the development of the online learning materials for authors of Cochrane reviews saw the preparation of six modules, which were made available to UK-based authors in an extended pilot.

A version has now been prepared that can be hosted on a more widely accessible web learning platform. It is envisaged that this will be launched on the Cochrane website (www.cochrane.org) this month, for use by anyone with an Archie login (i.e. Cochrane review authors).

- Cochrane Consumer Co-ordinator. The Cochrane Collaboration has appointed Catherine McIlwain as its Consumer Co-ordinator. This new post is intended to improve the level of support available to consumers, and the Cochrane groups with whom they engage. This demonstrates Cochrane's dedication to its end-users and its belief in the importance of involving consumers in the development of systematic reviews.
- Cochrane in the USA. To celebrate the Joint Colloquium of the Cochrane & Campbell Collaborations in Keystone, USA, later this month, The Cochrane Library has published a special Editorial on Cochrane in the USA. ### Cochrane Oral Health Group to launch Professional Global Alliance

The COHG is to establish a Professional Global Alliance in early 2011. In return for an annual contribution, members of the Professional Global Alliance will be consulted on the prioritization of reviews to be undertaken by the Group, and representatives will join an Advisory Group to ensure that the oral health reviews published in The Cochrane Library are of the highest quality: up-to-date, accessible and authoritative. It is anticipated that the additional funding for the Group will increase the number of reviews and review updates published each year. The funding will be used to employ three additional members of staff at the Editorial Base to carry out this important work. To date, the International Association for Dental Research, the British Orthodontic Society, the Australian Dental Association and the Spanish Dental Association have pledged support for the Alliance, and the COHG is in consultation with many other groups and associations over the proposal.
