Cochrane Collaboration international organisation that aims to help people make well-informed decisions about healthcare by preparing, maintaining and promoting the accessibility of systematic reviews of the effects of healthcare interventions.

The Cochrane Oral Health Group (OHG) aims to produce systematic reviews which primarily include all randomised controlled trials (RCTs) in oral health. Oral health is broadly conceived to include the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of oral, dental and craniofacial diseases and disorders.

The OHG is composed of persons from around the world who share an interest in developing and maintaining systematic reviews relevant to the field of oral health. Reviewers are encouraged to collaborate on reviews and the OHG is able to facilitate contacts with colleagues around the world. The group is co-ordinated by an Editorial Team who edit and assemble completed reviews into modules for inclusion in The Cochrane Library (an electronic database updated quarterly).

### **Cochrane News**

- UK & Ireland Annual meeting 2011. The 16th Annual Meeting of UK and Ireland-based contributors to The Cochrane Collaboration will take place in Belfast, Northern Ireland on the 15th and 16th of March 2011. Registration is now open at <a href="http://ukcc.cochrane.org/">http://ukcc.cochrane.org/</a>.
- Cochrane audits. The Cochrane Collaboration are currently performing an audit to assess the quality of summary of findings tables, abstracts and plain language summaries of Cochrane Reviews. The audit will be restricted to new reviews only and will focus on reporting rather than conduct. This is one of many activities going on as part of the ongoing process of improving Cochrane reviews.
- box next to each heading • OHG Editors meeting. The OHG are holding a 2-day meeting on the 1st and 2nd of March 2011. This will be a chance to update our whole editorial team on the latest issues relating to Cochrane reviews and plan ways to improve our methods and service. We would be interested to hear from people whether there are areas we could improve on and also regarding things we are doing well.
- Cochrane Incentive Scheme. Recently Cochrane Review Groups were invited to nominate up to three reviews or review updates that they considered important and for which they considered the award of an incentive payment would lead to completion of work at a significantly earlier time. We are very happy to report that 2 OHG reviews were selected for the scheme: 1) Interventions for the treatment of oral and oropharyngeal cancers: surgical treatment (update); and 2) Interventions for the management of dry mouth: non-systemic therapies (new review). This means that you can expect to read the completed reviews later this year.
- Annual Cochrane Colloquium 2011. The Cochrane Collaboration holds annual conferences, known as 'Colloquia', which are open to everyone. Colloquia are designed to bring people together in one place to discuss, develop and promote our work, and to shape the organisation's future direction. This year the Colloquium will be held on the 19th to 22nd of October in Madrid, Spain. The website for registration is coming soon - keep an eye on the main Cochrane website (www.cochrane.org) for details. The 2012 Colloquium will be held in Nanning, China and the 2013 event will be in Vancouver, Canada.
